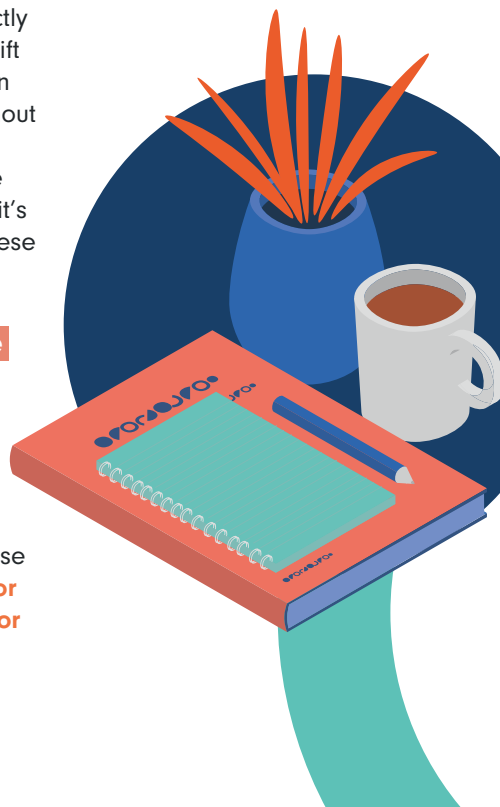


# How to optimise your eAssessment platform for educators and examiners
